

Jan T.M. van der Meer MD PhD – Biography

Dr. Jan T.M. van der Meer is Senior Consultant/Associate professor of Internal Medicine and Infectious Diseases at the Amsterdam University Medical Center (the Netherlands), location AMC. He is also a board registered epidemiologist. He trained as an internist and infectious disease specialist at Leiden University Medical Center where he received his PhD degree in 1992 on the thesis “Endocarditis Prophylaxis: Fact or Fiction?” Part of his training as an epidemiologist was received in the U.S.A (Tufts University, Boston, MA, and University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, MI).

His research is focused on infective endocarditis, HIV/AIDS and HIV/HCV coinfection. He is conducting studies on *S. aureus* bacteremia associated endocarditis

He is (co-)author of over 150 papers in peer-reviewed international scientific journals. He was chair of the Dutch Heart Association’s working party on endocarditis prophylaxis and of the AUMC’s antibiotic committee and member of the European Medicines Agency’s Scientific Advisory Group on HIV/Viral Diseases. He was treasurer of the Dutch Infectious Diseases Society (VIZ). He was closely involved in drawing up national guidelines on HIV/HCV-coinfection, treatment of infective endocarditis (chair), meningitis and *S. aureus* bacteremia. Dr. van der Meer organized the ISCVI Symposium of 2000 (Amsterdam).
